Reader: We should not give more value to anything made by human hands than we give to God.

Congregation: We will only worship The One True and Holy God.

Pastor: God commands us not to take his name in vain.

Reader: We should not curse, swear, or shame the name of our God.

Congregation: We will only use the name of God with honor and respect.

Pastor: God commands us to keep the Sabbath day holy.

Reader: We should not treat the Lord's Day like every other day.

Congregation: We will set aside Sunday as a special day of rest from our regular routines and make worshiping God with fellow believers a priority.

Pastor: God commands that we honor our father and mother.

Reader: We should hold our parents in high regard and respond respectfully to their guidance.

Congregation: We will respect and obey those whom God puts in authority over us and in doing so we follow God's fifth command.

Pastor: God commands that we do not kill.

Reader: We should never try to intentionally hurt others.

Congregation: We will remember the instruction to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Pastor: God commands us not to commit adultery.

Reader: We should not think disrespectful thoughts about others and not view images which lead us into sin.

Congregation: We will keep our hearts and our marriages pure.

Pastor: God commands us not to steal.

Reader: We should not take what does not belong to us.

Congregation: We will be honest and trustworthy.

Pastor: God commands us not to lie.

Reader: We should not say untrue or hurtful things; we should not twist or embellish words to mislead others.

Congregation: We will speak truthfully and build others up with our words; both spoken and written.

Pastor: God commands us not to covet.

Reader: We should not want possessions or talents that others have or waste our time thinking about how we can get them.

Congregation: We will be thankful and content with what God has given us.

Pastor: The Law is summed up with this command, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength." We are also told to love our neighbor as ourselves. Strive to obey all of God's commands. In doing so, you will live with gratitude and joy!
